INTRODUCTION:

Kapili College, Kheroni, West Karbi Anglong was established in the year 1995. It has been imparting higher education (FYUGP) Arts to the students of rural backward and Hills area. The College is running under Assam University, Silchar (**A Central University constituted by an Act of Parliament in 1994**). It was granted permission and affiliation by Assam University, Silchar vide its letter No.AUD/C-51/97/053 dated 31-05-1997. The Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council (KAAC) also accorded concurrence to the college vide letter No.KAAC/Edn/Affiliation-11/18/A/4584 (A) dated 26/11/1997. The Government of Assam accorded Concurrence in 2013 vide its letter no. AHE/481/2012/26 Dated 19/03/2013.

This is the only Higher Educational Institution situated in Kheroni Phelangpi area of West Karbi Anglong in a plot of 35 Bighas of Land covering a vast area about a 50 fifty Sq. Km. radius (Approx) from its centre Kheroni. The motto of the institution is “**Transformation Through Education**”. A well equipped infrastructure facility is abundant. The KAAC fulfils all the requirement of infrastructure after inspecting it in every year. The College has been producing a good number of human resources since its inception.

NEP 2020 in the Degree Courses starts from the Academic Session 2023-2024 onwards as per the”AUS FYUG PROGRAM REGULATIONS, 2023 under NEP 2020”

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS:

1. DISCIPLINE:

- * Students are expected to observe strict discipline in the College. Any violation thereof will entail severe punishment.

2. PUNCTUALITY:

- * College Timings : General Shift :- 09:15 am to 03:30 pm
- * Late comers must obtain permission from their HOD before entering the class. Student have to take permission if they want to enter inside the college after 9:30 am from the Principal.
- * Repeat offenders will be penalized.

3. IDENTITY CARD:

- * Students should wear their identity card at all times when inside the campus.
- * Students without ID card will not be permitted entry into the campus.
- * New and replacement ID cards are issued at the college office.
- * Students must surrender their ID cards at the end of their degree program

4. ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE:

Each student shall have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/ Tutorials/ Practical classes in each paper of all the courses as per the recommended Course Structure of the concerned programme of study so as to eligible for appearing ESE of that paper . Class Attendance shall be calculated based on actual number of classes held during each semester in each course/ paper. Number of decimal be rounded off to next higher number (e.g., 74.01% be rounded off to 75%).

5. ANTI RAGGING CELL: Anti Ragging Cell is constituted anually to prohibit ragging of students.

6. RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- * Ragging is prohibited and will lead to dismissal from the college.
- * Misuse of mobile phone cameras within campus will lead to suspension of the student.
- * Smoking, drugs and alcohol are prohibited inside the campus violations will lead to dismissal.
- * Students shall not engage themselves in actions that are offensive to good and are disservice to succeeding generations of students of the college.

- * Students must observe strict discipline in the campus; behave with dignity and courtesy to the principal, faculty members, administrative staff, visitors and fellow students.
- * Political activities and the functioning of student organisations are strictly banned in the Campus. Unofficial meetings, strikes, demonstrations, agitations, and fund collection are strictly prohibited. Students who violate the above rules are liable to be dismissed from the college summarily.
- * No student shall bring in to the college campus any banner, flag, board, notice, pamphlet or other such materials for purpose of any political activity of student organizations or other organisations.
- * The College Management and Principal shall take appropriate measures to insulate the college campus from political activism and external intervention, to safeguard the interests of students, academic community, parents and the general public. Students and staff shall co-operate with all such measures including the mode of College Union election as decided by the College Management and Courts from time to time.
- * Election to the College Union, if required, will be conducted under Parliamentary Mode, as per Lyngdoh Committee recommendations, under the verdict of the Hon.ble High Court of Kerala in WPC © No.19411 of 2012, de hors the directions issued by the University. No meeting or entertainment shall be organized nor any fund collected in the college.
- * Students must wear uniform on the prescribed occasions and working days. Students should always keep dignity and decency in dressing..
- * Staff members/Discipline Committee shall have the powers to deny admission to students to classes/office//library/meetings/cultural programs and other programs in the case of violation of the dress code of the college.
- * Students shall always wear identity cards issued by the college with tag and show them as and when demanded by the Principal, teachers and office staff/ security staff.
- * No student shall use or keep in possession alcoholic drinks or drugs.Using/ keeping of these items will lead to immediate expulsion of the student from the college.

- * Students shall not enter classrooms other than their own.
- * Mobile phones, cinematic dance and fashion show shall not be allowed inside the College campus. Violating these rules will meet with disciplinary action, A fine of Rs.500/- will be levied for the use of mobile phones. Mobile phones with camera will be confiscated.
- * Students guilty of going over to other colleges or institutions to take part in acts of indiscipline such as organizing demonstrations or strikes will be deemed especially culpable and be punished accordingly.
- * The Principal shall have the power to inflict the following punishment: fine, loss of attendance, loss of term certificate, suspension, compulsory issue of T.C. and expulsion.
- * Conduct certificate will not be issued as matter of course. It has to be earned by students' good conduct. Promotion to a higher class, selection for University examinations and issue of progress, attendance and conduct certificates are matters absolutely within the statutory and discretionary powers of the Principal and no appeal shall lay against the Principal's decision to any other authority.
- * The principal shall have the right to issue Transfer Certificate to a student admitted to the college without an application from the students or the guardian at any time during the course of his/her study in the college without assigning any specific reason.
- * The principal may frame and issue disciplinary rules from time to time of permanent or temporary character, regulating the conduct of students within and outside the college. Student without helmet / valid license will not be permitted to bring bikes inside campus.

PROGRAMME REGULATION:

Continuous and Comprehensive Assessment (CCA): CCA is a parameter to assess learners' performance continuously and comprehensively internally by the colleges throughout the semester. It is also known as Internal Assessment

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): SGPA is a measure of performance of work done in a semester. It is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): CGPA is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over all the semesters. The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all the semesters

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO FYUG PROGRAMME: A learner shall get admission in the First Semester of FYUG taught in the college and admission to First Semester of FYUG shall be governed by the admission criteria and, the Rules and Regulations mentioned in the prospectus published by the college. No candidate shall be admitted to FIRST SEMESTER of FYUG programme of study, unless he/she has passed the qualifying examination.

COURSES: Course in simple terms corresponds to one Paper under a particular 'Subject'. Multiple subjects constitute a programme of study the courses should define learning objectives and learning outcomes. A course may be designed to comprise of lectures/ tutorials/ laboratory-work/ field-work/ outreach-activities/ dissertation/ project-work/ vocational training/ seminars/ assignments/ presentations etc., or a combination of some of them. Courses in a programme of study may be of 08 (Eight) types viz.

- i) Discipline Specific Core (DSC),
- ii) Discipline Specific Minor (DSM)
- iii) Interdisciplinary Course (IDC)
- iv) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)
- v) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)
- vi) Value Added Course (VAC)
- vii) Dissertation/ Project
- viii) Internship

DISCIPLINE SPECIFIC CORE (DSC): This is the course which is to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core requirement to complete a programme in a specific discipline of study. The purpose of keeping Core Course in a programme of study is to ensure that all the institutions follow a minimum common curriculum so that each institution adheres to common minimum standard. Also, the course designed for papers under this category aim to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline. Language Course (English/ Hindi/ MIL) are treated as Core Courses.

DISCIPLINE SPECIFIC MINOR (DSM): The courses offered under the main discipline of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Minor Courses. From Discipline Specific Minor, Students shall take two subjects related to his/her Discipline. Each such subject should of 50% of total credit allotted to this course Viz; for 3 year UG programme, each Discipline Specific Minor shall be of 13 credits and for 4 years UG programme, each Discipline Specific Minor shall be of 17 credits.

INTERNSHIP/COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT/FIELD WORK: This is a new and significant component of FYUGP under NEP 2020. This is a compulsory 2 credit Course for 5th Semester students of all Disciplines under FYUGP as per UGC guideline. In this component there are three alternatives viz., Internship, Community Engagement and Field Work.

INTERDISCIPLINARY COURSES (IDC): Three interdisciplinary courses i.e. IDC-101, IDC-151 and IDC-201 with 3(three) credits each shall be studied in the entire FYUG programme in First Semester, Second Semester and Third Semester respectively. There are 04 baskets viz : Natural Sciences (NS), Social Sciences (SS), Humanities (HN) and Commerce & Management (CM). Students may opt for any one from those 04 baskets in each of I, II & III semester.

ABILITY ENHANCEMENT COURSES (AEC): Ability Enhancement Courses are the compulsory courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines. For AEC courses, there shall not be any internal exam. Total Marks for AEC examination shall be 50 with two hours examination duration.

SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSES (SECs): SEC Courses opted in 1st Semester shall remain same for all three semesters. Semester-wise change of SEC is not allowed. However, in case of change of DSC and DSM subjects in 3rd semester, change of SEC may be considered subject to fulfillment of other conditions. SECs are the compulsory value- based and/or skill-based aimed at providing hands-on training, skills, etc. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability. SEC shall have to be opted from either DSC or DSM.

VALUE ADDED COURSE (ADC): This is also common to all FYUG students of 1st and 2nd Semester. This course comprises of NSS, NCC, DTS, Sports, HW, Yoga, GCS and UI. NSS, NCC, Sports and Yoga are having both theory and practical components and remaining subjects are without practical component.

DISSERTATION/ PROJECT WORK: Dissertation/ Project Work is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving/ analyzing /exploring a real-life situation/ difficult problem. A Dissertation/ Project Work is an optional paper and in lieu of Project / Dissertation in VIII semester, students shall have option to take three additional courses as Discipline Specific Courses which will be equal to 12 credits in total. For students with Honours and Research, DSC-451 paper shall be Research Methodology and the content of the Course shall be School-specific. However, for other students, DSC 451 shall be a usual 500 level paper. However, students opting for project / dissertation will be given Honours with Research degree and students opting for additional three Discipline Specific courses in lieu of Project/ Dissertation will be given Honours degree. It is decided that in their respective prospectus each college should categorically mention this.

RESTRICTION FOR CLUSTERING OF SUBJECTS: Both DSC and DSM should be selected from within either of the clusters. Same subject cannot be selected as DSC, DSM and IDC. Student should opt for two DSM, one as first minor and the other as second minor. Opting one literature as DSC and other literatures as DSM and IDC are not allowed. For opting DSC and DSM combination, clustering of subjects shall be as per below mentioned cluster.

1. Social Science
2. Humanities

PROGRAMME OF STUDY UNDER NEP 2020: The programme of study is to be called as “Four-Year Under Graduate under NEP 2020” and in short ‘FYUG’ shall be a 8-semester programme of 4 (four) years’ duration and, there shall be 4 types of Certifications based on Exit from the FYUG system namely Certificate, Diploma, Three Years Bachelor’s Degree and Four Years Bachelor’s Degree with Honours/ Honours with Research.

COURSE STRUCTURE: There shall be only 4 programmes of study under FYUG programme namely,

One Year Certificate Course after successfully completion of One year study without any arrear(s) with earnings of 40 credit in total.

Two Years Diploma Course after successfully completion of 02(two) years study without any arrear(s) with earnings of 80 credit in total.

Three Years Bachelor’s Degree under FYUG after successfully completion of 03(three) years study without any arrear(s) with earnings of 120 credit in total.

Four Years Bachelor’s Degree with Honours/Honours with Research after successfully completion of 04(four) years study without any arrear(s) with earnings of 160 credit in total.
